Curriculum Connection

The English Language Arts and Literacy Standards have clearly defined goals for each grade level. Ocean City students in Pre-Kindergarten through fourth grade are working hard to meet the expectations that are defined in each grade level so they will be well prepared for the next grade. The following provides examples of what your child will be working on in each grade level and what you can do with your child to support learning at home.

In **third grade**, children are reading closely to find main ideas and supporting details in a text. They are comparing the most important points and key details presented in two books on the same topic. Students are reading stories and poems aloud fluently and are able to distinguish between literal and nonliteral meanings of words. Parents can reinforce these skills at home by making reading a part of your child's daily routine and start a family vocabulary box or jar, where family members write down new words they discover and share them with the family.

In **fourth grade**, children are paying close attention to key features of informational books and articles, these include understanding the main idea and supporting details, being able to compare and contrast information, and explain how the author uses facts, details, and evidence to support particular points. Children are also independently conducting short research projects on different aspects of a topic, using evidence from books and the internet. Parents can reinforce these skills at home by picking one story in the news, read it together, and discuss with your child what it means.

2013 Educators Community Foundation Grants

Ocean City Elementary School (OCES) and Cedar Chapel Special School were recently awarded 2013 Education Award Grants from the Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore.

OCES was awarded a grant to support the school's first grade STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) program. The grant will be used to purchase digital microscopes and iPads. "The digital devices will support hands-on inquiry -based science instruction that supports a universal design for learning," explained OCES Principal Dawn Rogers. "The devices will also help ensure that all students are immersed in unique learning experiences. In preparing students to be college and career ready, our first grade teachers hope to provide rich learning experiences that permit our students to generate ownership of their learning."

With the Community Foundation's

education grant, innovative software will be purchased by CCSS. According to CCSS Principal Belinda Gulyas, the software will provide educators with the ability to assess, monitor and scaffold reading and listening comprehension for students with moderate to significant cognitive disabilities. The Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore recently honored schools and educators with over \$50,000 in grants through the Foundations 2013 Education Award Grants Program. The Community Foundation awards grants to schools whose programs enhance learning experience for students through creativity and innovation.

2014-2015 Pre-K and Kindergarten Registration

The goal of Pre-Kindergarten in the public schools is to provide learning experiences to help young children build their skills so they are more likely to do well in school. To be eligible for the Pre-Kindergarten program, children must be **four years old on or before September 1, 2014**. In addition, they also must be from families that are economically disadvantaged or homeless. All economically disadvantaged children who apply must be enrolled first; however, if there are spaces left, other children may be enrolled.

Children who will be five years old on or before September 1, 2014 <u>must</u> register for Kindergarten. Children who are currently attending Pre-Kindergarten at OCES **must** register for Kindergarten.

We will begin making appointments for registration on January 15, 2014. Please call Ocean City Elementary School on January 15, 2014 at (410) 632-5370 to schedule a registration appointment.

Kindergarten registration will occur on March 19th and 20th.

Pre-Kindergarten registration takes place on April 9th & 10th.

The following documents <u>must</u> be brought to the registration appointment:

- Birth Certificate (not a birth registration notice)
- Social Security Card
- Current Immunization Record
- Proof of Residency in the Ocean City Elementary School district (deed, lease, or utility bill that lists a service area in the OCES district)
- For PreK registration only: proof of income (2013 income tax return)



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
