#### From the School Nurse

Illnesses in children are as much a part of winter as cold weather. If your child experiences any of the following symptoms, please do not send them to school:



**FEVER:** temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or more within the past 24 hours

**VOMITING:** vomiting within the past 24 hours

**DIARRHEA:** 3 or more watery stools in a 24 hour period

**SORE THROAT:** especially with fever or swollen glands in neck

#### CHRONIC COUGH/GREEN NASAL

**DISCHARGE:** should be seen by a health

care provider

**EYES:** thick mucus or pus draining from

the eye or pink eye

#### **Curriculum Connection**

#### 10 Things Parents Need to Know About Testing in Maryland

- 1. MSA will be given in reading and math in grades 3-8 in March.
- A small number of students in every school will take the field test of Maryland's new Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC).
- Students who take the PARCC field test in one subject area (either reading or math) will take the MSA in the other tested area.
- 4. Parents will continue to receive individual student reports on their child's MSA scores.
- 5. Parents will not receive individual scores on their child's performance on the PARCC field test.
- 6. Federal law requires that all Maryland students take an annual statewide assessment or the State risks losing millions of dollars in funding.
- 7. Next school year, 2104-2015, all Maryland students in grades 3-8 will take PARCC assessments in reading/ELA and math.
- 8. Although new academic standards have been implemented this year, the MSA continues to provide teachers, parents, and students with valuable information.
- Information from the PARCC field test will be used to refine and improve the assessments before they are given to all students next year.
- 10. If you have additional questions about testing, ask your child's teacher or principal.

#### 2014-2015 Pre-K and Kindergarten Registration

The goal of Pre-Kindergarten in the public schools is to provide learning experiences to help young children build their skills so they are more likely to do well in school. To be eligible for the Pre-Kindergarten program, children must be **four years old on or before September 1, 2014**. In addition, they also must be from families that are economically disadvantaged or homeless. All economically disadvantaged children who apply must be enrolled first; however, if there are spaces left, other children may be enrolled.

Children who will be five years old on or before September 1, 2014 <u>must</u> register for Kindergarten.

#### <u>Children who are currently attending Pre-Kindergarten at OCES must</u> register for Kindergarten.

If you have NOT called the school to schedule an appointment, please do so.

Kindergarten registration will occur on March 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>.

Pre-Kindergarten registration takes place on April 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>.

The following documents <u>must</u> be brought to the registration appointment:

- Birth Certificate (<u>not</u> a birth registration notice)
- Social Security Card
- Current Immunization Record
- Proof of Residency in the Ocean City Elementary School district (deed, lease, or utility bill that lists a service area in the OCES district)
- For PreK registration only: proof of income (2013 income tax return)
