Curriculum Connection

PARCC Field Testing

This year a randomly selected group of students in grades 3 and 4 will be taking the PARCC Field Test. The new PARCC assessment, Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers, will replace the Maryland School Assessment for the 2014 – 2015 school year. Each school in Worcester County is participating in some type of PARCC field testing this school year. The purpose of the field test is to examine the quality of items in order that PARCC can build assessment forms for the 2014 – 2015 school year; pilot assessment administration procedures; and give schools and districts the opportunity to experience the administration of PARCC assessments. The PARCC field test will include a Performance Based Assessment (PBA) and an End-of-Year Assessment (EOY). Both types of assessments will be taken online. The selected third grade students will be taking the PARCC field test in Math, while the selected fourth grade students will be taking the PARCC field test in English Language Arts (ELA). Students who participate in the PARCC field test will not have to take that content in MSA, but they will be required to take the other content for the MSA test. So if they take the ELA in PARCC, they will not take the MSA reading test but will take the MSA math test. The students participating in the PARCC field test will be taking the Performance Based Assessment during the testing window of March 24th – April 11th. Those same students will also complete the PARCC End-Of-Year Assessment during the testing window of May 5th – June 6th. A letter notifying parents of their child's selection for the PARCC field test will be sent home sometime in the upcoming weeks. Music Matters

The students in Mr. Chapman's music classes have been listening to and reading about Felix Mendelssohn. Mendelssohn was an 18th century composer from Germany. We have been listening to excerpts from A Midsummer Night's Dream, a work inspired by the play by William Shake-



speare. The children have been surprised to learn that the famous wedding song, used as many brides come down the aisle, was actually composed by Mendelssohn and comes from A Midsummer Night's Dream.

All students are now performing station work. During each unit, students are graded on their performance skills in keyboard and rhythm instruments. In addition, they will receive grades on written responses while listening to music, and on activity sheets that include reading about Mendelssohn and answering questions using the text.

The O.C.Stars will begin rehearsals again during the week of January 13. I was extremely proud of our many performances during the holiday season and look forward to preparing for new challenges in the spring. Thank you for your wonderful support during our traveling adventures.

2014-2015 Pre-K and Kindergarten Registration

The goal of Pre-Kindergarten in the public schools is to provide learning experiences to help young children build their skills so they are more likely to do well in school. To be eligible for the Pre-Kindergarten program, children must be **four years old on or before September 1, 2014**. In addition, they also must be from families that are economically disadvantaged or homeless. All economically disadvantaged children who apply must be enrolled first; however, if there are spaces left, other children may be enrolled.

> *Children who will be five years old on or before September 1, 2014* <u>*must</u> register for Kindergarten.*</u>

<u>Children who are currently attending Pre-Kindergarten at OCES must</u> <u>register for Kindergarten.</u>

We will begin making appointments for registration on January 15, 2014. Please call Ocean City Elementary School on January 15, 2014 at (410) 632-5370 to schedule a registration appointment.

Kindergarten registration will occur on March 19th and 20th.

Pre-Kindergarten registration takes place on April 9th & 10th.

The following documents <u>must</u> be brought to the registration appointment:

- Birth Certificate (not a birth registration notice)
- Social Security Card
- Current Immunization Record
- Proof of Residency in the Ocean City Elementary School district (deed, lease, or utility bill that lists a service area in the OCES district)
- For PreK registration only: proof of income (2013 income tax return)
