Notes from Nurse McCabe

Cold and flu season is here! Please:

- Have your child wash their hands thoroughly for 10 seconds with soap and water throughout the day. If soap and water is not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub or sanitizer.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing and sneezing. Throw the tissue away and wash your hands. If a tissue is not available, cover your mouth and nose with your sleeve.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Keep your children home if they are not feeling well.

- Do not send your child to school if they have a fever (100 degrees F and up), vomiting, diarrhea, chronic cough, green nasal discharge, mucus from the eyes, or a sore throat.
- Do not return your child to school until it has been at least
 24 hours without a fever without the use of medications.
- Consider getting a flu vaccine for you and your child.

Curriculum Connection

The Maryland College & Career Readiness Standards have provided opportunities for teachers to make "shifts" or changes to their Reading classroom instruction.

As a parent, you can help support your child with these reading changes at home. Below you will find a chart, explaining some of the changes in English/Language Arts and what you can do at home to best support your child.

The "Shift"	What will the students have	What can parents do to help?
Read as much non-fiction as fiction	 Read more non-fiction Understand how non-fiction is written and put together Enjoy and discuss details of non-fiction 	 Supply more non-fiction texts Read non-fiction books aloud or with your child Have fun with non-fiction in front of your child
Learn about the world by reading	 Learn more about science and social studies through reading Use "primary source" documents Gain more knowledge through the use of text 	 Supply series of texts on topics that interest your child Find books that explain how things work and why Discuss non-fiction texts and their ideas
Know more vocabulary words	 Learn the words they will need to use in college and career Expand the depth and knowledge of vocabulary words 	 Read often and constantly with young children Read multiple books on the same topic Talk to your children, read to them, listen to them, and play word games


