School Safety and Security

As you have probably noticed, new safety and security procedures are in place for this school year. Below are listed the new procedures which must be followed by all visitors to ensure the safety of our students:

- All exterior doors will be locked during the school day.
- Front doors of the building will be locked from 8:45 AM until 3:20 PM daily.
- All visitors during the school day hours will be asked to activate the electronic security system, identify themselves and their purpose, and be admitted by office personnel.
- Any visitors who wish to be admitted to the school and visit further than the office will be required to provide a photo ID. This information will be recorded electronically by a Visitor Management System and a photo ID badge will be issued. This badge must be worn in a visible location during your visit.

- Before exiting the building all visitors must properly checkout in the office.
- Parents picking students up from AM Pre-Kindergarten are asked to not arrive any earlier than 11:25 AM. You will have to activate the security system and be buzzed into the lobby for pick up.
- Parents dropping off for PM
 Pre-Kindergarten are asked
 to please arrive no earlier
 than 12:20 PM. Students will
 be greeted at the front
 doors by their teachers.
- Parents picking up at the end of the day are asked to please arrive no earlier than 3:20 PM. We will not be admitting anyone into the lobby until the doors are unlocked at 3:20 PM.
- A School Security Deputy is now on the premises during the school day to ensure safety in the building and on our grounds.

Stand Up, Speak Up! By Mrs. McGean





As I look back on my school days, I can remember times when kids at school were bullied. You probably can, too. Bullying is repeatedly hurting others with unkind words or actions. Bullying is something done over and over, it's on purpose and it's meant to be hurtful. Bullying has been getting a lot of attention recently, but it's hardly a brand-new problem. What is new is society's attitude toward bullying. What used to be acceptable as "kids will be kids" has changed. Bullying can be a serious problem, with young victims being hurt and young bullies growing up to be abusive adults

At OCES we are committed to providing and maintaining a safe, nurturing learning environment for all students. In order to do this, we are dedicated to educating our students about bullying, how to prevent it, and what to do if it

occurs. It is our responsibility to ensure that our school environment is a "bully-free" zone, and also to equip students with the tools they may need to deal with bullying in other places.

The OCES bullying prevention program, "Stand Up, Speak Up" teaches students specific strategies for addressing someone who is bullying them and encourages "bystanders", children who witness someone else being bullied, to speak up in defense of the targeted child.

We encourage parents to talk with their children about bullying. Help to empower your children to stand up for themselves and for others who may be bullied. While this is difficult for some children, it is an important life skill. Have your children practice saying, "Stop it!" "Cut it out!" or "Go away" in a loud powerful voice.

The more they practice the more comfortable they will feel if they need to use this strategy. Assure your children that it is always okay to tell an adult if they are hurt or feel intimidated by someone. This is not "tattling," but rather asking for help.

Each month the OCES newsflyer will feature the "Stand Up, Speak Up" word of the month and a role-playing scenario that teachers and students will discuss. We encourage parents/guardians to continue this discussion at home.

School Lunches: Pay in Advance!

Lunch is available daily from the cafeteria for those students wishing to purchase a school lunch. Parents may choose to send in a check or cash to put money on their child's lunch accounts. Purchases will be automatically deducted and children will wear a reminder sticker home when the account is low. If a check is returned for insufficient funs, no additional checks will be accepted. Students will not be allowed to "charge" lunch. Students who do not have money for lunch will be given a serving of fruit, a serving of vegetables, and milk.

Worcester County Schools have enrolled in an internet

based service called Café Prepay. It is a website where money can be put on your child's school meals account using your VISA, MasterCard, or Discover card. This is a voluntary program. To get started, you will first enroll at www.cafe-prepay.com You will be asked to enter your email address and password, which will be used each time you log in.

Parking Concerns

Please note, the stone covered area of our parking lot is **NOT A PARKING AREA**. That area is a designated drain field, and **NOT** suitable for parking. Thank You!

Parking, Drop Off, and Pick Ups!

When dropping your child off in the morning, please remember to drive forward as far as possible and follow the directions of the teachers on duty.

Also, if you are parking your car and walking your child in, you MUST park in a designated parking spot.
The stone covered area is NOT for parking.

If you are picking up your child at dismissal, remember to park in the designated areas. Do not park along the curb. Children must be picked up by a parent or designated adult. Children WILL NOT be sent out to your car. Please do not leave your car unattended.

Remember: DO NOT PARK in the HANDICAPPED spaces unless you have a handicap sticker or tag!

Accelerated Reading Program

Accelerated Reader will be up and running for grades 1-4 beginning September 16. Thank you to the OCES/PTA for providing the funds for AR Real Time. The children have access to over 140,000 book tests! Each time Renaissance Learning adds a new test, we have immediate access.

In order to know if a book is a test book, you can access AR BookFinder. The website is: www.arbookfind.com
Simply log in as a student or parent (no password needed)
and type in the name of the book. Be sure to check that the author and title match when the books are listed. Under each title the test number is provided as well as reading level and point value. We mark books in the Media Center with the AR number and reading level to make selection a bit easier for the children. There will no longer be a printed AR list. Letters will be coming home soon concerning the Home-Connect component of AR. We are placing a very strong emphasis on reading nonfiction books. What a great way to learn new things together as you talk about the book with your child! Above all, THANK YOU for encouraging your children to read everyday!
